## 1. TIN structure

Format	Explanation	Comment
9999999999	11 digits	For the purpose of IT processing, the TIN should be written as a block of 11 digits without any point, space, dash or slash sign

## 2. TIN description

Belgium issues TINs, which are reported on official documents of identification. For individuals the TIN corresponds to the "Numéro National (NN)", which is attributed when a registration on the national Register of the physical persons is made. This number of identification consists of eleven digits and is a unique number of identification for every registered person.

## 3. Where to find TINs?

The "Numero National" (NN) appears in the following documents:


# 3.1. Official identity card (back side) only for Belgians citizens (Carte d'identité officielle).


